September 21 – Aquatic Plant Primer with Mary Leck **10:00 AM to 3PM ?**

Spring Lake

Aquatic plant primer, an introduction; all are welcome. Leader: Mary A. Leck. In the morning, we will examine common wetland species in and around the lake, but *Heteranthera multiflora* and *Wolffiella gladiata*, NJ rare species, are likely. After lunch, we will visit a tidal marsh site, part of the northernmost tidal freshwater wetland on the Delaware River; access there is muddy, be prepared for wet walking. Knee high boots or VERY old footwear are recommended especially for the tidal site. Bring lunch and beverage; insect repellent is not usually needed.

Meet at Spring Lake at 10 AM, Roebling Park, Hamilton, NJ. (from South Broad St. (NJ Rt 206), turn onto Sewell Ave., at the end, turn left and drive down the hill to the parking lot).
